## Terms of Reference

The Terms of Reference should be read in conjunction with the Highvale P.S School Council Standing Orders. The Partnerships and Education Sub-Committee is a sub-committee of the School Council.

## Purpose:

## The Partnerships and Education Sub-committee shall:

- Actively explore and build partnership opportunities within and beyond the school community to support the achievement of School Goals in the Strategic and Annual Implementation Plans and facilities development.
- Be aware of Highvale Primary School's unique school community, including Student Family Occupation (SFO) and cultural mix to inform opportunities for partnerships.
- Develop a strategy to enhance partnerships for Highvale Primary School including parents, industry and government.
- Consider grant submissions in the light of Council policies and priorities.
- Make recommendations to Council for endorsement of grant submissions.
- Source and prepare applications for suitable grants.
- Maintain the keep up to date the 'local' and designated 'optional' policies in the HPS Policy Review schedule.
- Consult with the Highvale Primary School staff and community and make recommendations to Council on aspects of 'local' and designated 'optional' policies.
- Where requested, support the HPS Leadership Team with the drafting of 'Privacy Impact Assessments' (PIA) to identify the impact a project may have on the privacy of students.
- Contribute recommendations to the HPS Leadership Team for managing, minimising or eliminating that impact.


## Membership:

- At least three people. At least one of these must be a member of the School Council and is the convener.


## Meetings:

- The Partnerships and Education Sub-Committee will meet at least twice each school term and prior to normal council meetings to consider education issues as described. It will ensure that appropriate reports and recommendations are prepared for council.
- If the convenor of the Education Sub-Committee is absent or unable to preside at the meeting, a member other than the principal elected by the members present at the meeting must preside.
